Graphics SIG

1. The SIG meets in the Computer Club Classroom from 4 to 5:30 PM on the 2nd Thursday of the month from October thru March.
2. The current focus of the SIG is to learn about the latest apps and programs that help members enhance their photos, videos, illustrations and other graphic related platforms.
3. In the first two sessions of the upcoming 2020-21 year, (the Oct and Nov meetings), the SIG will introduce you to the vast array of Adobe Photo and Video Programs for your PC, tablet and smartphone and discuss how they work, and how you can download them to your PC or device.
4. In December 2020 and January 2021 SIG meetings the focus will be on learning the steps and techniques to make short videos using various simple programs and also how to share them on various SM platforms.
5. In February and March 2021 we will look at the various social media platforms you can use to edit and share your photos and videos and create some fun special effects.
6. In every session we update members about upcoming classes, (dates, and times) that you might be interested in taking, based on your interest in the SIG and give a short summary of what each class is about.
7. The SIG has additional special presentations with guest speakers to share information about new classes and new application updates.
8. There are many "hands on" sessions where you learn how to use an app or editing process, on your own device.
9. In each session, members share information and insights as to how they created their specific work of art, discuss, exchange ideas, and demonstrate the process with other members.
10. The SIG is always open to participant suggestions on adding or modifying monthly topics based on interest and direction of the group members.



New Technologies SIG

1. Our mission is to provide the club members with a forum for the open discussion of technologically advanced ideas and experiences.
2. We examine device upgrades and enhancements and the different ways to build or modify your own devices to obtain improved function and performance.
3. We provide "hands on" demonstrations and presentations of the latest software and hardware advancements. The subject matter discussion may sometimes be more advanced and presented at a higher level than our general classes.

These subjects include hardware/software relating to advanced video, networking, security and the latest cutting-edge technologies. Most operating systems are addressed such as Windows, OS X, Chrome OS, LINUX, Android, and iOS.
4. We work with the Grand Computers Club Board of Directors to upgrade and acquire state-of-the-art equipment for use in our classes, meetings, and SIGs.

Examples include 7.1 surround sound, 4K/Ultra High Definition video projector and monitor, mobile device broadcast ability (Chromecast, Airplay, Miracast, etc.) and Listen Everywhere, a hearing assistance audio system.
5. We meet every month of the year to provide a continuous flow of news and technology development.

Due to the temporary closure of our meeting facility, we conduct the meeting via video conferencing apps like Zoom and Skype.
6. Even though the meeting discussions can become technical for the novice, there is opportunity to ask for a simpler explanation of the terminology.
7. The meetings are mainly a presentation with interaction from the audience, and sometimes a live-demonstration or video. As with most live demonstrations of new technology, there is always a chance of some disappointing or humorous results.
8. The monthly meetings are normally held in the Grand Computers Club classroom on the 3rd Thursday of every month from 3:30-5:00pm. If the topic is popular, the room can get full. The annual attempt to get a larger room in the Chaparral Center has not been successful the last few years. If a larger room can be obtained, then we can have a better and more comfortable seating experience including desktop space for your devices, beverages and snacks. Maybe video conferencing can help.
9. Possible upcoming topics for the next few months are: Bluetooth 5 for headsets and other device connections; latest progress on the 5G network rollout; Chromebooks that can really get the job done; video production on the cheap; personal privacy - is it too late to close the barn door?; and What's in your Man-Cave or She-Shed?

Digital Scrapbooking SIG

1. We use one of the top-of-the-line photo editing programs, Adobe Photoshop Elements version 2020, which is now equipped with artificial intelligence to teach new and easier methods of enhancing photos. This enables you to be creative, enhance, organize, repair or resize .jpeg files and photos.
2. Many of our members are not interested in Digital Scrapbooking at all. They prefer to learn new techniques and get ideas to enhance their pictures. They then make projects such as Family History collections, charts, cards, slideshows, collages, posters, flyers and wall art, mugs, blankets, tee shirts, etc. with photos for their friends and family to enjoy.
3. It does not matter if your platform is Mac or a PC. Both work equally well with the Adobe Photoshop Elements programs. The only requirement is your computer must have the latest operating system software (i.e. Windows 10 or Mac Catalina), virus protection and security programs installed, and Adobe Photoshop Elements version 2018-2020. Your laptop should be less than 5 years old to perform effectively with the Adobe programs. Computers are available in the classroom and open use room to work on.
4. Give a portion of yourself to family/friends as you share your creations and preserve memories (either as hard copies or online).
5. The digital photo enhancements presented in our meetings can help you improve photos that you may want to post to Facebook, Instagram and other social media sites.
6. Use the tools you already have more efficiently, that is: digital files, a computer (with maybe a flash-drive) and your own creative juices.
7. You do not have to know how to put together a Digital Scrapbook before attending our SIG meetings. If you want to learn how to make a digital or hard copy scrapbook with your own photos, we will teach you how to organize your digital supplies to get started and then assist you in creating a beautiful photo keepsake book.
8. Save space in your home as you consolidate, and backup scanned and digital items.
9. Members of our group are always learning something new.
10. We have a lot of fun in our twice-monthly meetings!
